There are eye exercises to assist balance and strengthen the muscles used for peripheral vision, which are needed for driving. Steady As You Go is a falls prevention programme and is held weekly, for one hour.

Who Are They???

We are a small group of volunteers who are here to protect our properties in the Bulls area and observe and trouble spots. We are the Eyes and Ears for our dedicated local police. Our history dates back to 1997 when Bulls Watch-a-bull was initiated by our then local service clubs Jaycees, Rotary and Lions. Our membership at the time was 67 personnel. In 2001 CPNZ being Community Patrols of New Zealand was formed and Bulls Watch-a-bull then came under the umbrella of this national body.

What They Do:

1. Patrol residential, business and industrial areas
2. Acting eyes and ears for our police
3. Undertaking surveillance and observation
4. Taking notes, recording and gathering information
5. Assisting when asked, at accidents
6. Watching for stolen vehicles
7. Reporting signs of suspicious activity

TO SURVIVE WE NEED MORE MEMBERS TO JOIN.**

At present we are a husband and wife/partner set up which works well as there are strict rules laid down, that there must be two patrol members on at once. We supply free shirts and all the equipment required, plus training. A police check is also essential.

BOOK REVIEW BY BULLS LIBRARY

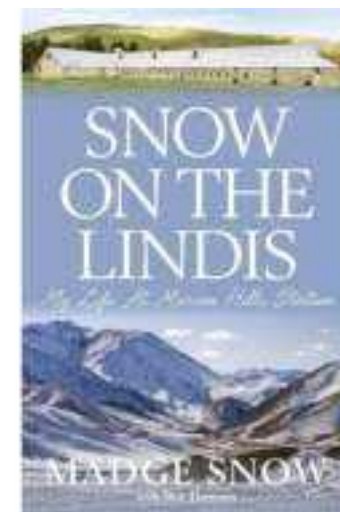
Snow on the Lindis : My Life at Morven Hills Station

My favourite part was how they hoodwinked the Wellington inspector when he came to check on how they were fulfilling their obligations on stock numbers.

He would go out to count the sheep and at the end of the day he would go back to the main house for the night where they would have a few drinks and the next day he would go out again to count stock and after a few days of counting he left happy with the knowledge that the station had good livestock numbers... unbeknown to him, each night he was drinking with the boss, the shepherds were out mustering and shifting stock into new paddocks for the inspector to count the following day. He had no idea that he was counting the same sheep.

The Bulls RSA is a small family friendly club located in the main street of Bulls. Annual membership is \$40 allowing access to all RSA clubs and NZ affiliated clubs. 
