





BULLS POST OFFICE

The first Post Office in Bulls was in the store of Mr James Bull and is believed to have opened in 1860. It was known as "Middle Rangitikei" Post Office. On 1st December 1871, Mr Harland F Ward took up duty as the first permanent Postmaster.

Mr C. L. White was appointed Registrar of Births on 1st April 1895 and the first birth was registered 2nd April 1895.

In 1872 the name of the Post Office was changed to "Bulls" in order to perpetuate the name of Mr James Bull.

The first available record of the mail service in the Rangitikei District is contained in the report of the Postmaster General for the year 1859 - 1860. A telegraph office was opened in Bulls in 1871. In 1872, 1114 telegrams were sent and their value was £93 pounds 19 shillings and 9 pence. In 1872 a money order and savings bank were opened and during the following year 168 money orders were issued for £793 and 74 were paid for the sum of £388.

The telephone exchange was opened in September 1905 with 12 subscribers, hours of attendance 9 -5.

July 27^{th} 1906, the new two storied brick Post Office in Bulls was opened, at a cost of £2300. (\$4869 in todays money) This was to be one of the most up to date country offices in the colony. This was to be completed with a clock at a cost £165 (\$349.370)in todays money. Half of which was from the residents of the district.

The building was supposedly fire -proof but was gutted from sparks from the burning shop next door. A new interior was built in the shell of the old building and re – opened 22 August 1910. The clock tower was added to the building, installed and started 6^{th} September 1912.

In 1983 a new Post Office was built on the section next to the old one. The clock was moved into the new building and still works today, as the Post Office building was sold to the local doctor.

The Post Office was tendered out and is situated at the local chemist shop.



Many overseas visitors, many purchasing magnets and the like.



FOODTOGETHER CONNECTING COMMUNITIES THROUGH HEALTHY KAI

With the cost-of-living crisis hitting us all hard at this time a lot of people are looking at alternative options to buy fresh food for their families. An initiative that has run well in Palmerston North for many years and that we are investigating bringing to Bulls is a Foodtogether co-op.

A Foodtogether Co-op allows communities to offer a variety of fruit and vegetable packs to local customers. Offering great value for money, Foodtogether boxes are ordered online the week prior to delivery. On delivery day, customers make their way to the pick-up point and collect their pre-paid order of produce. The cost of the box is no more than \$20 and each Foodtogether box is made up of a variety of fresh seasonal fruit and vegetables totalling 6-8 varieties. The produce is different each week so you will never get bored eating the same thing week in and out.

Kia ora koutou, on Sunday 17 September I had the pleasure of attending Te Matoro o te Tumuaki Tuawaru o te Haahi Rātana which was a meeting of the followers of the Rātana faith held in the Marton RSA and Citizens' Memorial Hall.

This was an opportunity for the mana whenua of Marton being Ngā Wairiki Ngāti Apa to formally meet at a Church

Service with the new Tumuaki, Sonny Tamou. The Memorial Hall was full to bursting and this was a very significant occasion for both Rātana and our iwi and I was very pleased to be able to represent Council. I attend numerous functions at Rātana and sometimes attend their Church Services in the Temple and I feel as though I am very much part of the community so it was nice to be able to sit alongside them and support them on Sunday.

At the moment all of New Zealand and Local Government are effectively in a holding pattern while we wait for the outcome of the general election. Whichever party is elected there is likely to be significant change in things such as the Resource Management Act and the provision of services within the Three Waters – wastewater, drinking water and stormwater. We are currently in the middle of a planning cycle called the Long Term Plan and the government position will be crucial to understanding what our responsibilities will

be in these areas. If there is to be a change of government, which some of the media seem to predict, there will be an enormous number of changes that Council



will have to work with. Often with elections, Local Government and Central Government people talk about "what can a new party or council do in the first 100 days?". This tends to be a catchphrase but in this case the first 100 days will be absolutely crucial in terms of our planning cycles. Both Council and staff literally wait with bated breath as to what their roles will be.

On top of that Council is also going through a process around who would deliver our roading maintenance contracts over the next nine years. Our contract currently sits with Higgins and while there are a limited number of contractors who would have the capacity to be able to deliver, I would love to see contracts awarded where local contractors can be part of those discussions. Being honest, the state of our roads are a huge concern to both myself and Council. The maintenance of them is dropping away and the amount of money that the government has to spend in this space is driving that change.
