

Show Entries

All rose entries in classes 1-33 must be phoned in to Michelle Brown on 027 644 4009 between 3 to 5pm on Friday 22nd November alternatively you can email bullsbrowns@gmail.com the week leading up before 5pm Friday with your name, and approximately how many entries in each category.

Your tickets will be ready to collect Saturday morning from the hall.

- Novice rose entries can be made on the day as long as they are staged by 9.30 am Saturday
- Late entries may be accepted on the day at the discretion of the Chief Steward - if there is room
- All staging is to be done on the flat tables
- A Gold Coin donation covers your entry fees
- Note the use of vases:

Miniature type roses – small white vases only Novice entries – black vases (except for class 42) All other rose entries in green plastic vases

Entries close Saturday 9.30am Judging Commences 10.00am





Exhibitors! Please name your roses (if possible) as the public like to identify a rose which may take their fancy.

All exhibits are to be left in place until the close of the show.





Rules

- 1. All exhibits for this show must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor and grown in their own garden except, (a) in the case of recently imported new rare plant/s or, (b) flowers for decorative exhibits.
- 2. Exhibitors unable to attend, may forward exhibits to be staged on their behalf but entries must be in their name.
- 3. In order to prevent confusion and to protect the property of the exhibitors, all exhibits shall remain untouched until the close of the show. The Bulls Rose Show Committee will not be held responsible or any loss or damage whatsoever.
- 4. No artificial aids or supports of any kind are allowed except in the Floral Art section.
- 5. All Roses must be staged with at least 6 inch stems.
- 6. The decision of the Judges will be final and they will not award prizes in cases of insufficient merit.
- 7. In all sections for points prizes:
 - 1st prize is 5 points
 - 2nd prize is 3 points
 - 3rd prize is 1 point
- 8. All exhibits must be staged by 9.30am Saturday. Warning bell at 9.15am.
- 9. Judging will commence by 10.00am and only appointed officials shall be allowed in the hall during judging.
- 10. All cups are to be held for one year only. Winners are responsible for the engraving. Engraving and cups to be returned by the 1st November 2024 to Te Matapihi, Bulls Community Centre or contact Heidi on 027 848 9125.

Definition of Stages of Roses

Stems must be longer than 6 inches and have foliage.









Bud Pecorative Bloom * 1/4 to 1/2 Open Exhibition Bloom 1/2 to 3/4 Open

Fully Open Bloom Past 3/4 Open

* A bud must have all sepals separated, colour showing and no more than two petals unfurling.

Note:

1 x Large Stem - You must have a minimum of 4 flowers open (you can have more and some buds too)

1 x Small Stem - Not more than 3 flowers open.

ROSE SHOWING HINTS

- ◆ Get to the venue early enough to give yourself plenty of time to do your staging. Bring with you a little kit that contains name cards for your roses, a pen, sharp secateurs, a mister, small pair of scissors, a cloth or tea towel to wipe up water spills and don't forget "the schedule". Get all your vases ready and, it sounds silly, but make sure they have water in them.
- Your rose stems will need some good support in the vase. Many exhibitors use damp floral foam cut to fit the vase. You can use damp newsprint paper wrapped firmly around the stem and pushed into the vase. Check out where your entry is to be placed in the respective classes you have entered.
- Stewards will be available to help exhibitors, particularly those that are new to showing roses.
- ♦ When judging has finished make sure you check over "the champion" winning entries as it will give you guidance what to strive for next time. Ensure you have fun with your exhibiting and "good luck".



ROSE SHOWING HINTS - BY PETER ELLIOT

- Saturate your rose beds 24 hours prior to cutting your roses. They will last better on the show bench.
- As early as possible, remove any developing side buds from the entries you plan to use for Decorative, Exhibition and Full Open blooms.
- For the Large Stems of Roses classes, early removal of the central bud from a cluster will improve the shape of the flower head. You will need at least 4 flowers open though.
- Roses are best cut the evening before the show so they can be kept in a cool place such as a garage or bathroom. Take a bucket of water to the bushes so the stems can be quickly immersed. When needed, carefully take the stems out of the bucket in reverse order to how they went in. You will get less tangling of foliage that way.
- ◆ Try to cut the stems long—you can always shorten them a little on the day if needed. Stem length should be about 1.5 times the height of the vase they will be staged in. You can recut your stem just a little – under the water – in your staging bucket before you put the roses in the vase. This should help prevent any rose blooms wilting or going floppy.
- Check the illustration in the schedule for the desired stage of opening in the bloom classes. Bring some spares for your classes in case they change while transporting hot cars etc
- Any spray stains or dirt can be wiped off foliage with a cottonwool ball soaked in a little milk. Don't remove any foliage unless absolutely necessary because it will upset the balance of the stem and bloom. Don't put leaf shine on the foliage.
- ♦ Make sure your buckets are secure in your car or boot and won't tip. Some well placed bricks can help or even some seatbelts.
