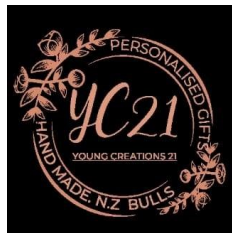

Firstly, I would like to quickly take this opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Grayson Marsh, and am the new principal here at Sanson School. As we reach the halfway point of the year, Sanson School is thrilled to share the incredible journey we've embarked upon during the first two terms and offer a glimpse into the exciting plans we have for the term ahead.

We have had a jam-packed first half of the year, including numerous sporting events with the Te Kāwau cluster and muscling through two cross-country runs at Tangimoana and Bainesse. It was fantastic to see our students pushing themselves and giving their best. Last term, we focused on "E kore au e ngaro; he kākano i ruia mai i Rangīātea" - "We know who we are and where we come from; therefore, we can move forward with confidence." Students investigated their own stories from the past to understand and celebrate their unique identities, along with the shared history of Aotearoa. It was amazing to learn about our ancient Polynesian navigators and the paths they took to find Aotearoa, even 3D printing our own Waka Hourua. At the end of the term, we took an exciting trip to Wellington, hopped on the cable car, and explored the Space Place observatory. We learned about navigation, the stars above us, and even explored the unique stories around Matariki. It was a very special trip!

This term, our key focus topics are Geography, the Olympics, and Science. We are excited to explore more about the world around us, the continents, and some of the amazing countries participating in this year's games in Paris. We will also delve into various science topics, including 'The Physical World' and 'The Living World.' Our students will conduct experiments involving electricity, bacteria, fungus, and chemical reactions. To inspire our love of science we will be heading into the Science Roadshow in Palmerston North.

We are super excited about the term ahead.

FROM THE Mayor's Desk

Kia ora koutou, I am using this newsletter to acknowledge the work done at Papakai Park in Taihape. For many years people like the late Les Thurston, Joe Byford, Don Tantrum and team have nurtured the bush on the banks of the Papakai and Mt Stewart. They have put in paths, removed Old Man's Beard and unwanted species like the sycamores. Remember also, that they have been the drivers, along with others, of the planting and maintenance of the lookout at the Mt Stewart Reserve.

Friends of Taihape Charitable Society's committee undertook the project to rejuvenate the reserve's forest and tracks in partnership with Ngāti Tamakōpiri and

Rangitikei District Council. Friends of Taihape have been the glue that has tied the work at Papakai and the bridges together. This project has been eight years of planning and fundraising to get to this position. The project connects Taihape township's native reserves along the Hautapu River, delivering a multi-use native flora experience. The essential linking component of the reserves are the bridges, which adjoins both sides of the River's tracks and parks. The upgrade of Papakai Park is in effect the continuation of that vision.

Our district has been built on the backbone of community support and it is great to have the time to tell this story.

Rangitikei District Council adopts new drone policy

Rangitikei District Council has adopted its new drone policy, which covers the use of drones over Council owned and administered land. Known as the Operating Unmanned Aerial Systems (drones) on Council Owned and Administered Land Policy, it covers all Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS), including model aircraft, and sets out where users of such systems have permission to use them above our land. Drones are becoming more popular with recreational users which causes a potential risk to aircraft in the busy airspace around the southern Rangitikei District due to the proximity of Base Ōhakea to our border. The aim of the policy is to provide guidance on the CAA rules and RDC's code of conduct for flying drones above our land. More information can be found at www.rangitikei.govt.nz/dronespolicy

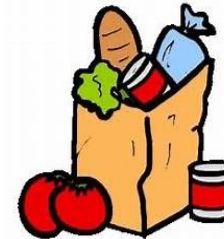
