



Well, the Rangitīkei has certainly been a busy space through the start of this year and in terms of events we have had plenty. The Country Music Festival at Wilson Park in Marton saw in excess of 700 motor homes on site. My guess is this was an increase of about 150 over the previous year. This is, I think, due to two things – it is seen as a premier event on the country music circuit and the Topp Twins appearing for first time in 3 years was certainly a drawcard. Congratulations on a fantastic event! There were many other events on during January and February – the Turakina Highland Games again a standout with a record number attending and fine weather for a change.

For Councillors we are back in the thick of it. We are getting to the sharp end of decisions around Local Water Done Well and

consultation on our preferred future water services delivery model will take place from March 5th - April 2nd. For staff this means an incredible



amount of time comparing the costs of how we handle water services now, and what the charges could be under council's preferred model - a sub-regional organisation with Whanganui and Ruapehu District Council's. The Annual Plan consultation will come quickly after where we consider the work we will be doing in year 2 of the Long Term Plan 2024-34. We are also hoping to shortly present the community with a possible programme for the repair of the Marton Swimming Pool ahead of next season.

Very soon, we're going to be consulting on Local Water Done Well (LWDW), and how water services will be delivered to you in the future!


We know that it's complicated and, let's be honest, not the most exciting thing in the world. So we've tried to simplify it.

As things are now, Council manages the governance and water services for Rangitīkei residents. If under Local Water Done Well, Council does move to its preferred arrangement, which is a combined Council Controlled Organisation (CCO) with Ruapehu District Council and Whanganui District Council, it would mean the service delivery would be managed by the CCO.

FREE SCHOOL UNIFORM ALTERATION SERVICE

Rangitikei District Community Hubs in partnership with Marton Uniform Exchange are now providing a free uniform alteration service to parents of schoolchildren. Organiser Katle Deere says that the uptake in parents requesting uniforms has been strong in the New Year, and they regularly post on their Facebook page that they're looking for donations. The idea for the alteration service came about when Katle was talking people that donated uniforms that weren't in great condition. "Some people were reluctant to give us their old uniforms because they were missing buttons, had tears or broken zips. But those are things that can be fixed, so we started looking for people who might be able to help us," says Katle.

Katie spoke to Justine Rowe, Rangitikel District Council's Tamariki/Rangatahi Youth Engagement Officer, who was donating some uniform to the exchange and from that chat, Justine looked at how Council could assist.

The service is available to Rangitikel residents who live outside of Marton as well. Uniforms that need altering can be dropped into the Taihape Library and Te Matapihi, then delivered to Marton for alteration and returned on completion.

Turnaround times will be dependent on demand and anyone getting alterations done can contact Marton Library to get an estimated time of completion of their uniforms. People who have uniforms that they would like to donate can email martonuniform exchange@gmail.com to organise collection or drop off.





Our next meeting is on Wednesday 5th March Come along and say hi. Everyone is welcome.






