Housing Minister Chris Bishop has unveiled an MBIE discussion document on 'granny flats' as part of NZ First's coalition agreement with National. The document aims to simplify the process of building a minor dwelling. The proposed changes would allow property owners to build small dwellings up to 60m2 on their existing properties without the expensive and time-consuming process of getting resource consent.

Cost savings would vary from region to region, but could be up to \$20,000, depending on the consents and contributions you may not have to pay.






