As I write this article, we are nearing the end of June and have passed the shortest day.







Notes from our Small Animal Vets

This month our focus is Senior Pets

Recognising Pain in Older Pets: Subtle Signs to Watch For

As pets age, their bodies change, just like ours. Conditions like arthritis, dental disease, and internal issues can cause chronic discomfort. But unlike us, pets can't tell us when something hurts, and they often hide the signs. Here's what to look out for:

- Mobility changes Hesitation on stairs, reluctance to jump, slower movement, or stiffness after rest may all point to joint pain.
- Behaviour shifts A friendly pet becoming withdrawn or grumpy, increased vocalising, whining, or pacing could be signs of pain or distress.
- Changes in eating or grooming A sudden drop in appetite could signal dental pain or nausea. Cats that stop grooming, or dogs that over-groom one spot, might be experiencing discomfort.
- Sensitivity to touch Flinching, growling, or crying out when touched can be a clear red flag.
- Posture and breathing A hunched back, stiff body, or shallow rapid breathing may suggest internal pain.

If you notice any of these signs, don't just put it down to old age. Book a check-up with your vet. With the right support, from joint supplements to medication and lifestyle changes, your senior pet can enjoy a much more comfortable and happy life.

Notes from our Production Vets:

Most of the routine vaccinations should be well underway or completed by now, Pre-lamb clostridial for ewe flocks, and lepto, salmonella, and rotavirus for both dairy and beef herds.

Pre-calving jobs are likely wrapping up too. Calf sheds cleaned and disinfected, and new staff inducted into farm protocols.

For those bottle-feeding lambs or calves for Ag Day, swing by our clinics for everything you need to get them off to a great start.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS 2025

"Your District is calling" Rangitīkei residents encouraged to stand for Council



With the 2025 local elections fast approaching, it's time for people to start thinking about standing for Council. In the 2022 local elections, three ward seats were won uncontested because there weren't enough candidates to hold an election.

"Local government is in a delicate position with lots of change happening at speed. Balancing council commitments and your own work or personal responsibilities can be tough, so we want to make sure people know what it's like to be an elected member," says Rangitīkei District Council Deputy Electoral Officer, Katrina Gray.

Nationally, the number of uncontested seats at the last local elections reached an all-time high. Low pay, increasing time commitment and public abuse were cited as the main reasons why outgoing elected members were choosing not to stand again.

"Being an elected member can be hard, but there are many reasons why elected members find real fulfilment and purpose in their roles. Contributing to and serving your community is incredibly rewarding, especially when you see the benefits of the projects and initiatives you've advocated for, realised," adds Katrina.

Many believe that you must be business orientated to be a successful elected member, but Rangitīkei District Council Chief

Executive, Carol Gordon says a passion for your community and desire to see Rangitīkei thrive shouldn't be underestimated.

"Financial and business acumen are valuable skills to have – understanding governance is also important, but these are skills that can be learnt and developed throughout your term.

An open mind, critical thinking and analysis, relationship building, collaboration, communication, and a genuine care for Rangitīkei residents is necessary.

"People who are community minded and want to leave our district in a good place for future generations tend to be the ones who connect the most with voters and make for good elected members around the Council table," adds Carol.


