





Skin and Ears Month

Notes from our Small Animal Vets

Itchy dogs and cats are a common concern for pet owners. Frequent scratching, licking, or biting can signal allergies, fleas, or skin infections. This time of year, fleas are one of the main culprits, either from a flea allergy or an infestation in the environment. Even if you don't see fleas, they may still be present, as it only takes one to start the itchy cycle. If you spot a flea or flea dirt on any pet, treat all pets in your home with a reliable flea product for three consecutive months. Dry skin, poor grooming, or underlying health issues can also contribute. Left untreated, excessive scratching may cause sores or hair loss. If you're unsure, pop into the clinic - we can help.

Bloat in Livestock

Notes from our Production Vets:

There has been a lot of bloat in cattle around the area recently. Frothy bloat is common in spring and early summer when stock graze lush, legume-rich pastures such as clover and lucerne. Foam forms in the rumen, trapping gas and preventing burping, which causes swelling and breathing difficulty which can be fatal. Prevention focuses on good grazing management and supplementation. Reduce risk by avoiding sudden pasture shifts, feeding hay first, keeping cattle full, using bloat oil, or grazing sheep ahead to reduce clover. If possible, use a rumensin-type product through feed or a dispenser. Note: rumensin capsules are no longer available. Regular monitoring and gradual adaptation to lush pasture are key to prevention.

Horse Hoof Care

Notes from our Equine Vets:

With the varied weather and it still being very wet underfoot, regular trimming and hoof care remains important. We are still seeing a large amount of foot abscesses, these are painful causing mild to severe lameness often accompanied by heat, a strong digital pulse and swelling of the lower limb. Treatment involves opening the abscess to allow drainage, soaking and poulticing the foot by applying a bandage or hoof boot to keep the foot clean . As always with wounds, it is important to check your horse is up to date with its tetanus vaccination, otherwise a tetanus antitoxin is recommended. Please chat to us at the clinic if you have any queries.

Now the work begins - delivering for Rangitīkei residents and communities. In his speech, Mayor Andy reflected on the challenging environment this Council is


