


MEAT & CHEESE CHRISTMAS TREES

An Easy Holiday Appetizer. Check out this simple recipe for Meat and Cheese Christmas Trees! Only three ingredients are needed to make this festive snack. Makes 10 trees — Prep time: 20 minutes

INGREDIENTS — 15 slices pepperoni, 15 slices salami, Toothpicks 1 pound block of cheddar cheese, Small star cookie cutter

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Cut the cheese into ¼ inch slices, then use a small star cookie cutter to cut out 10 stars. Set the stars aside.
- 2. Cut the remaining cheese into 10 cubes.
- 3. Stick one toothpick into each cheese cube.
- 4. Fold each slice of pepperoni and salami into quarters (in half, then in half again) and slice three pieces of folded meat onto the toothpick on top of the cheese cube. 5. Place one cheese star on top of each tree.
- 6. Serve immediately or refrigerate until ready to serve.





INGREDIENTS

3/4 cup butter—softened, 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves, 1 cup sugar, plus additional for rolling, 1/4 teaspoon salt 1 large egg, room temperature, 1/4 cup molasses 2-1/4 cups all-purpose flour, 2 teaspoons ground ginger 1 teaspoon baking soda, 3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. In a large bowl, cream butter and 1 cup sugar until light and fluffy (5-7 minutes). Beat in egg and molasses.
- 2. Combine the flour, ginger, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves and salt and gradually add to the creamed mixture and mix well.
- 3. Roll into 1-1/2-inch balls, then roll in additional sugar.
- 4. Place 2 inches apart on ungreased baking sheets
 Bake at 350° until puffy and lightly browned (10-12 min)
- 5. Remove to wire racks to cool.

Top with icing and sprinkles if desired.





Festive Toxins to Avoid

Notes from our Small Animal Vets

As December brings holiday festivities, pet owners must stay mindful of common toxins and hazards that can harm cats and dogs. Chocolate, a seasonal favourite, contains theobromine, which can cause vomiting, diarrhoea, and even seizures. Ham and other rich holiday foods are high in salt and fat, increasing the risk of pancreatitis and digestive upset. Rawhides, often given as treats, should also be avoided — they can swell in the stomach, cause choking, or lead to dangerous blockages. Be cautious with holiday decorations too, as many contain harmful substances. Keep all these items well out of reach, and contact your vet immediately if you're concerned your pet has eaten something unsafe.

A Merry, Fly-Free Flock

Notes from our Production Vets:

With the warmer weather comes flies! Protecting your sheep from strike is a two part process: Reducing exposure through non-chemical controls

- Shearing
- Prevent dagginess crutch sheep to remove contamination & ensure adequate parasite control
- ·Timely removal of fly breeding grounds e.g. dead animals
- •Dock at an appropriate length tails too long or too short increase strike risk
- Treat/prevent wounds & other diseases e.g. footrot, shearing cuts etc
- ·Consider Fly traps— both for monitoring & reducing numbers

Reducing exposure/consequence through chemical controls (fly products)

We have options for lifestyler's to buy smaller quantities of products that prevent &/OR treat fly strike. Though be aware, that all of these products are only as good as their application (read the label) & there is now some resistance to certain actives so still keep a close eye on your sheep.

Treat Lightly This Festive Season

Notes from our Equine Vets:

As a veterinary clinic, we see first hand how the holiday season can pose risks for horses. Over December, it's tempting to give extra treats, but too many treats can lead to weight gain, increasing the risk of laminitis and joint issues. If you're planning to be away, please arrange for someone to check on your horse daily—many accidents happen when horses are left unsupervised. Ensure they have fresh water, safe fencing, and are monitored for any signs of discomfort. With careful attention to diet, exercise, and supervision, you can help your horse stay healthy and safe throughout the festive season.
