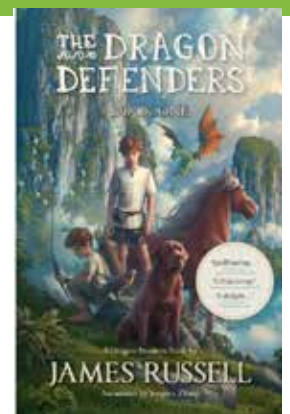

By James Russell RRP \$22

The first book of The Dragon Brothers Novel Series, this book follows on from the best-selling picture book series The Dragon Brothers Trilogy. The two brothers Flynn and Paddy are now 12 and 10 years old respectively, and are facing a challenge like no other. This is one of the world's first novels to incorporate augmented reality (AR) content. The AR Reads app, downloaded onto a device, will bring the novel to digital life.



The Vanishing Place By Zoe Rankin RRP \$37.99

On the remote West Coast of the South Island, vast forests stretch out between mountain ranges and rugged beaches. There, in the small town of Koraha, not a lot happens - until a young girl with blood on her hands walks out of the bush and into the local store, collapsing to the floor. She can't - or won't - speak to anyone. It's the town's sole policeman who recognises her face. She looks exactly like a local girl who disappeared twenty years ago. A twisty and daring thriller about how those close to you can be even more dangerous than the deadliest wilderness.

Its time to think about Flea and Worm

Notes from our Small Animal Vets

As the weather warms up, it's a good time to check that your cat or dog's flea and worm protection is up to date.

Fleas aren't just an itchy nuisance. They can cause skin irritation, allergic reactions and, in heavy infestations, even contribute to anaemia. One flea can also mean there are many more developing in the environment, with eggs, larvae and pupae hiding in carpets, bedding and outdoor areas.

Worms can be easy to miss too. Pets may carry intestinal worms without showing obvious signs, while heavier burdens can cause weight loss, diarrhoea, poor condition and other health problems. Some worms can also pose a risk to people, making regular parasite control important for the whole household.

The right flea and worming schedule depends on your pet's age, lifestyle, weight and individual risk. An indoor cat may have very different needs from a dog regularly exploring farms, parks or beaches.

Not sure if your pet is covered? Check when their last treatment was given or have a chat with our team. We can help you choose an appropriate product and create a parasite protection plan that suits your pet.

Vaccinations and Docking

Notes from our Production Vets:

Spring means plenty of new arrivals, and giving lambs and calves the best start involves more than just making sure they're well fed.

Vaccination plays an important role in protecting young stock from preventable diseases. Lambs and calves initially receive some protection through antibodies in colostrum, but this protection doesn't last forever. A well-timed vaccination programme helps their own immune system build protection against serious diseases, including clostridial diseases such as tetanus and pulpy kidney.

Timing matters, and vaccination programmes can vary depending on the animal, property and products being used. If you're unsure what your lambs or calves need, or when boosters are due, have a chat with your vet.

For lambs, docking is another important part of early management. Docking involves shortening the tail, primarily to reduce faecal contamination around the back end and lower the risk of flystrike. It needs to be carried out at the appropriate age using suitable techniques, with animal welfare and pain management considered.

Good spring management is about setting young stock up for the months ahead — protecting them from disease, keeping them healthy and catching problems early.

Time to think about Worming

Notes from our Equine Vets:

When it comes to worms, strategic worming offers the best protection. Rather than automatically worming every horse at set intervals, we recommend using a faecal egg count (FEC) to help determine your horse's parasite burden and whether treatment is actually needed.

An FEC measures the number of worm eggs being shed in your horse's manure. The results help us identify horses that may require treatment and allow us to recommend the most appropriate wormer.

Why does this matter? Using wormers unnecessarily or repeatedly using the same products can contribute to wormer resistance, making parasites harder to control in the future.

Every horse is different, which is why a targeted approach is so valuable.

If you're unsure when your horse was last wormed or whether an FEC is the right next step, have a chat with our team. We can help you put together a parasite management plan for the season ahead.

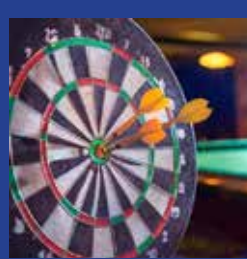
